We prepared for service with Mission Aviation Fellowship first in the UK and then at Bible College in Melbourne. David is pilot/base manager and Jen homeschools the boys and provides hospitality to visiting staff.

the actual ceremony. It was a colourful event, dominated by the green of the Dhurrkay clan set against the Uniting Church's robes and the traditional ceremonial wear of the elders and dancers. Parts of the New Testament are being translated into Wangurri, the clan's dialect.

found at the local dump but some trees were sawn and milled to provide hardwood beams. Our team have contributed labour for the foootings and welding skills in their spare time.
